Looking after the mental health of our workforce

- Everyday more than one construction worker takes their own life. In 2016, the
 figure was put at 450 three times the UK rate for men and six times the
 fatality rate for falls from height.
- The industry is overwhelmingly (more than 80%) male and men are far more likely to take their lives than women.
- Workers spend long periods away from home, friends and family, in an unforgiving culture.
- Loneliness; social isolation; gambling; alcohol abuse; bullying; job insecurity; abnormal hours.
- As a Client we will work collaboratively with suppliers around workforce welfare; e.g. information, training, advice and guidance; a 24-hour helpline; mental health first aiders; occupational health provision; welfare facilities.

NLHPP Overview




- Government granted approval to build and operate a new Energy Recovery Facility in 2017
- Treating 700,000 tonnes of waste per year at Edmonton EcoPark
- Enabling us to continue managing the waste that cannot be recycled in a proven, environmentally-friendly and cost-effective way
- The NLHPP will create new jobs and local supply chain opportunities





NLHPP introduction







First NLHPP apprentice



- The first NLHPP apprentice started working for Enfield-based construction company Galldris who are delivering the northern access works
- The apprenticeship is the first of 100 being delivered as part of the project and is in partnership with training providers including local colleges





On-site skills training



- 225 on-site skills training opportunities for residents of Enfield, Haringey or Waltham Forest
- Exploring opportunities to provide the training with Capital City College Training (CCCT)
- A detailed curriculum is currently being developed to include pre-employment training for school leavers or unemployed who are considering working in the construction industry



The first trainee is due to start in Spring 2020



Project targets



- We're aiming for a local employment target of 25%
 - We recognise the importance of maximising local benefits
 - Our contractors report to us on actions they are taking to advertise jobs and promote recruitment locally
 - Future contractors will be required to adhere to the Employment Relations Code of Practice which includes the requirement to prioritise suitably qualified local candidates
- We're aiming for a local expenditure target of 10%

EcoPark South



 The EcoPark south package of works includes construction the new Resource Recovery Facility (RRF) and EcoPark House

 The procurement started at the end of 2019 and the tender was officially launched at the start of 2020





Energy Recovery Facility (ERF) Procurement



- In January we held the first Market
 Information Event for the ERF
- An opportunity for potential suppliers to find out about works associated with the ERF
- Procurement is expected to launch in July 2020
- Contract awarded expected April 2022




February 2020 Construction Update

- The diversion is to allow for refurbishment and construction as part of the project and to ensure public safety is maintained






Weekend works on the EcoPark site
