

Safety moment



- Covid-19 is having a significant impact on young people's wellbeing and mental health.
- The Prince's Trust found that 40% of young people not in work, education or training feel "unable to cope with life". 48% cannot see an end to their unemployment.

NLHPP Overview



- The NLHPP will provide **proven**, **reliable and safe** waste management infrastructure for our residents.
- It is a vital part of our sustainable waste strategy and aim to preserve resources and protect the environment today and for future generations.
- Enabling works started in January 2019, ahead of main construction works beginning in January 2021.



 We are committed to delivering local benefits. We're providing apprenticeship and training opportunities, recruiting local, using north London suppliers when possible, delivering a schools outreach programme and all our contractors pay the London Living Wage.



Keeping our workforce safe



We are prioritising the safety of our workforce through the following measures:



- Proximity tracking
- Weekly rapid antigen testing



- Additional PPE
- Daily temperature checks



- Use of work bubbles
- Handwashing stations





- Four contracts have completed including:
 - Northern Access
 - Sewer DiversionEnabling Works
 - Laydown Area east
 - Laydown Area west













• In January, construction started on **EcoPark South.**







- This includes EcoPark House and a Resource Recovery Facility which serves two main functions:
 - Recycling & Fuel Preparation Facility where waste will be sorted, and if suitable for recycling will be sent for onward reuse and recycling.
 - Public Reuse & Recycling Centre which, for the first time, will allow north London residents to take their recyclable and non-recyclable waste directly to the EcoPark.
- Contractors Taylor Woodrow are currently undertaking demolition and groundworks, ahead of piling works starting in March to lay the building's foundations.










From June, the above ground structure of the RRF will begin to take shape...







 Good progress is being made on the sewer diversion, which involves the diversion of two Thames Water sewers beneath the EcoPark. This work is required to make way for the new recycling facilities.

- In January, we announced a new agreement with Energetik, Enfield's local heat supply company, and LondonEnergy, the EcoPark operating company.
- The long-term heat supply via district heating will provide low-carbon heating and hot water for more than 10,000 homes in the Meridian Water scheme, with capacity to supply up to 30,000 more homes across the borough and beyond.









Procurement update



- Procurement for the Energy Recovery Facility is making good progress.
- Potential contractors were shortlisted in autumn 2020 and will submit their detailed proposals this spring.
- The contract is expected to be awarded to the successful contractor by the end of 2021.





Apprentices update



- So far, 13 apprenticeships have been created in roles across civil engineering, quantity surveying and business administration.
- During construction, NLHPP will create at least 100 apprenticeship opportunities. This summer we will advertise new roles though targeted social media advertising, job websites, the local press and our website.
- In February, we celebrated National
 Apprenticeship Week and shared our apprentices' stories on Twitter and LinkedIn.





Apprentices update



Craig Lackhurst, age 25 and Kaya Hinds, age 20 both from the London Borough of Enfield have had their apprenticeships extended. In November, they transferred from NLHPP contractor Buckingham, over to Barhale.





Craig says, "It's great that I am able to use the skills that I have developed during my time with Buckingham and progress them further with Barhale".

Kaya says, "I have loved my time at Buckingham and am glad I can stay involved on a Project which I am already familiar with".




On-site trainees update



- So far 34 on-site training placements have been delivered to help local residents learn new skills to start careers in construction.
- During construction we are delivering at least 225 training placements, providing residents with an opportunity to work towards obtaining a Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) card.

 Taylor Woodrow who are currently recruiting local residents to join their team working on the NLHPP.


