


EcoPark South

Works to deliver the new Resource Recovery Facility (RRF), public Reuse and Recycling Centre (RRC) and EcoPark House are progressing well.

- Piling works have begun to prepare the ground for the steelwork construction which will form the new facilities.
 Taylor Woodrow is using an innovative piling technique which is helping to reduce embodied carbon by 10-16%.
- This month, the first piece of steelwork will be erected and the above ground structure of the RRF will begin to take shape.
- Later this year, we will begin cladding and installing the roof and the internal fit out of the new facilities will be underway.







Delivery update



Sewer Diversion

- We have carried out complex engineering works to be carried out to divert the Angel and Chingford sewers running beneath the footprint of the future Resource Recovery Facility.
- Two 15-tonne Tunnel Boring Machines were used to carry out the works.
- An innovative tunnel drive shaft design was used to carry out the tunnel boring using two pipe jacks from a single shaft at the same time. This enabled them to recycle water through both machines and reduce the amount of water required by 65%.







Health, Safety and Wellbeing



We continue to prioritise the safety of our workforce and have introduced new measures to ensure the safety of those working on site during the pandemic:

COVID-19 Taskforce:

 Introduced a COVID-19 Taskforce to plan how the NLHPP will respond to the challenges from the COVID-19 pandemic

beable health check and tracking app

 Adopted a six-month contract for the Beable health check and tracking app. The safety bracelets track interactions between site workers to help construction sites work safely during COVID-19.

Antigen testing

Since January 2021, we have been carrying out rapid antigen testing on site. To date,
 1754 tests have been carried out on the NLHPP workforce

Occupational health checks

Contractor Taylor Woodrow have provided occupational health checks for their on-site staff.



Apprenticeship update

- 16 apprenticeships created so far in roles across civil engineering, quantity surveying and business administration. 10 of these have been fulfilled by Enfield residents.
- During construction, the NLHPP will create at least 100 apprenticeship opportunities for the local community.
- We are liaising closely with Haringey Works and Build Enfield and Waltham Forest to share apprentice opportunities and reach underrepresented and disadvantaged groups.
- We're also engaging with Women in Construction, YMCA and Build a Fairer Chance.








On-site training update

- 40 on-site training opportunities created so far. 83% of these have been fulfilled by residents of Enfield, Waltham Forest or Haringey.
- During construction, the NLHPP will create at least 225 on-site training opportunities providing residents with an opportunity to work towards obtaining a Construction Skills Certification Scheme (CSCS) card.
- We're currently welcoming new cohorts of trainees onto the NLHPP working with Taylor Woodrow. Residents can register their interest about the training placements by emailing info@northlondonheatandpower.london





Opportunities for local businesses



We're focussed on creating opportunities for local businesses. We are already working with:

- Enfield-based subcontractors Embassy Demolition and J O'Doherty Haulage and Waste Disposal, who have carried out demolition works across a number of projects.
- Walthamstow-based New Life Catering, who are providing canteen catering on the Laydown area.

Local business spotlight:

- Enfield-based IT consultant, James Clear-Tournas, recently carried out broadband connection works at the new Laydown Area office and welfare facilities.
- His technical expertise helped the Project identify a cost-saving solution which provided a service upgrade for LondonEnergy Ltd, as well as a fast and reliable connection to the Laydown Area offices.




Digital engagement




Throughout the pandemic we have increased our digital engagement to maintain communication with the local community whilst we haven't been able to hold physical events.

 Regular NLHPP website updates with FAQs, project news and announcements.




