Consultation so far

Thank you to everyone who has come along to our three exhibitions in December and/or given us their views via our feedback form so far. There are still FOUR exhibitions before the first phase of consultation closes on 27 January 2015.

The second phase is expected in May-June 2015.

What's this all about?

The North London Heat and Power Project is our proposal to build an Energy Recovery Facility to replace the existing plant at the EcoPark in Edmonton by 2025, so we can continue to recover energy – heat and power - from the waste left over after recycling.

Why a replacement facility?

Watch our video on our website to find out how we think waste that cannot be recycled should be dealt with in the future.



Current facility:

- Has served north London for 45 years
- Is likely to reach end of its useful life in 10 years
- Has diverted 21 million tonnes of waste from landfill

The replacement facility would:

- Have two lines together processing up to 700,000 tonnes of waste a year
- Generate electricity of around 70 megawatts enough to power 127,000 homes
- Have equipment to allow the heat to be used locally
- Have the most effective technology for emission control
- Retain a chimney stack

We also propose:

- A Resource Recovery Facility - including a Reuse and Recycling Centre and a bulky waste/fuel preparation facility
- A visitor centre
- Associated offices

Heat and Power

Waste is a resource and we'll make the most of it:

- We'll use it to generate renewable energy
- It can provide heat to a local energy network



Who are we

North London Waste Authority (NLWA) arranges the disposal of waste collected by the seven London boroughs of Barnet, Camden, Enfield, Hackney, Haringey, Islington and Waltham Forest.

Working with local councils, we encourage and promote the three messages of **reduce**, **re-use and recycle** through waste prevention work in the community.

What have people asked so far?

What is happening with the compost centre?

The compost facility will go when the replacement facility is built as it's where the new building will be sited.

Will there still be a chimney?

Yes, about the same size as now but the design can still be influenced by you.
