

Transforming Edmonton EcoPark

Spring 2026



North London Waste Authority (NLWA) is transforming Edmonton EcoPark through its North London Heat and Power Project, replacing the oldest energy from waste facility in the country with the UK's most advanced energy recovery facility. It will continue to prevent rubbish going to landfill and use it to produce heat and power for local homes.

Construction Update

The Energy Recovery Facility (ERF) construction site remains very active, with visible progress being made each day. While the programme is behind its original schedule, key construction milestones continue to be achieved.

The main concrete and steel structure of the facility is largely complete, allowing the team to focus on installing the two boilers that will power the plant and the equipment to remove air pollutants. The link to the electricity transmission network and the overhead crane for the incineration bottom ash is also complete. Elsewhere, significant progress has been achieved on the turbine hall ahead of the arrival of the steam turbine generator.

NLWA and the main contractor are continuing to work together to drive progress forward. The ERF remains the best environmental and most cost-effective solution for disposing the bin-bag waste of more than two million residents, and NLWA is committed to ensuring this nationally significant infrastructure project is delivered for north London.
